



## MEN'S BASKETBALL: Depleted Titans on the Road Again to Georgetown

Tues., Mar. 22 -- NIT, at Georgetown, McDonough Gym (2,250), 7 p.m.

### TELEVISION:

Tuesday's game will be televised on ESPN, making this game Fullerton's first national basketball exposure since Jan. 29, 1990, when the Titans lost in overtime on ESPN at UC Santa Barbara, 72-64.

**"RADIO":** All games can be heard live on the internet on computers with sound cards. Listeners may access the CSF Athletics home page at [www.titansports.org](http://www.titansports.org) and follow the links. Mel Franks will be the announcer at Georgetown.

**THE QUICK SCENARIO:** The Titans (21-10, 12-6) are enjoying the second most successful season in their Div. I history, but at the rate they are going in the 2005 Post-Season NIT, they may not have enough players left for the opening tip-off at Madison Square Garden. Backup point guard John Clemmons broke a bone in his right foot the night before the opening round 85-83 overtime win at Oregon State and senior forward Ralph Holmes, the conference's leading scorer and rebounder, injured his left knee in Friday's 85-69 win at San Francisco and is done for the season. That leaves Fullerton with only eight players counting forward Danny Lambert, who has played only 18 minutes all season. In playing their third road game of the NIT, Fullerton will have seen seven different airports and been on the road for seven out of eight days with the prospect of three more days out of a suitcase if they pull a huge upset over the Hoyas.

**ACCOMPLISHMENTS TO DATE:** This is undeniably the second best season behind the 1977-78 NCAA Cinderella team in Fullerton's Div. I history. The 2004-05 Titans, who have the best record in Southern California and are the only team from California still playing, have:

- posted the school's first winning season since the 1992-93 team went 15-12
- posted 21 wins (a 13-3 finish), a figure surpassed only by the 23-9 mark in 1977-78 (CSF was 24-7 in 1961-62 at the NAIA level when school was known as Orange State College)
- won the school's first post-season games since 1978
- posted the best conference record (12-6) since the 1982-83 team went 12-4
- claimed the highest finish in the standings (tie for 3rd) since the 1984-85 team was third at 11-7
- posted the first winning road record (5-4) in conference games at the Div. I level (dates to 1974-75)
- posted the first winning overall road record at 11-8 (9-6 hostile, 2-2 neutral) since the 1988-89 team went 8-6
- posted the best home-court record (10-2) since the 1982-83 team went 13-0
- won their first Big West Conference Tournament game since 1998 and second since 1990
- posted only the third win over a Pac-10 opponent in 22 tries (21 of those games on the road)

**ABOUT THE HOYAS:** Georgetown (18-12, 8-8 Big East) beat Boston University in the opening round of the NIT, 64-34. The Hoyas lost their last five regular season games before beating Seton Hall and losing to UConn in the Big East Tournament at Madison Square Garden. Junior forward (6-8) Brandon Bowman (15.1 ppg), freshman forward (6-8) Jeff Green (13.1 ppg) and junior guard (6-2) Ashanti Cook (10.9 ppg) lead a balanced attack. Green is the top rebounder at 6.8 rpg. The Hoyas allowed opponents to shoot only 41.5 percent from the floor and have a 64.0 to 61.0 average scoring margin. The game is being played in McDonough Gym because the MCI Center is hosting a circus. It's the first home game there since 1993 and the first national TV broadcast from McDonough since Feb. 20, 1982.

**SERIES HISTORY:** This is the first meeting between the two schools, who do have a common opponent this season. Big West Conference member Long Beach State lost to the Hoyas, 57-51, on Dec. 22 at a tournament in Hawaii. The Titans and 49ers split their season series.

**Vs. THE BIG EAST:** Fullerton is 0-3 vs. the current membership of the Big East -- losing a single meeting with Connecticut (12/3/74), Providence (12/2/74) and Pittsburgh (12/28/79).

**THE COACHES:** John Thompson III is in his first year as coach at Georgetown. Bob Burton is 32-27 in his second year at CSF and career.

**THOMPSON CONNECTION:** Coach Thompson's father, John, coached one game in Fullerton's Titan Gym, guiding the 1988 U.S. Olympic team in an exhibition against an Athletes in Action squad.

**HOW THEY GOT HERE:** Fullerton won its first NIT game on its third (1983 and 1987) try on Wednesday, Mar. 16, at Oregon State, 85-83 in overtime. The Titans jumped out to a 51-35 halftime lead but fell behind by two in the final minute before forcing overtime. The Beavers led by three in OT and had the ball, but Fullerton caught up and won as Ralphy Holmes (27 points, 13 rebounds) made a free-throw line jumper at the buzzer. All five Fullerton starters played at least 40 minutes including 45 by both Holmes and Bobby Brown (27 points).

On Friday night, the Titans reversed the pattern. They played a listless first half and trailed host San Francisco, 30-28, at intermission. With Jamaal Brown getting all 18 of his points in the second half, the Titans raced past the Dons with 57 points for an 85-69 win. But Holmes, who almost had a double-double in the first half with 16 points and 9 rebounds, injured his left knee midway through the first half. He managed to play 37 minutes, adding 3 points and 4 rebounds in the second half. Bobby Brown (25 points) had 19 points in the second half. The last time Fullerton won two post-season games was in the 1978 NCAA Tournament when it won the opener of the Western Regional in Albuquerque, New Mexico, over -- San Francisco.

**HOW THEY REALLY GOT HERE:** The Titans left campus on **Tuesday**, Mar. 15, at 8:45 a.m. and bussed to Ontario Airport. They flew to Portland, Oregon, with a stop in Sacramento. They bussed 90 minutes to Corvallis and practiced at 7 p.m. After beating the Beavers on **Wednesday** night, they had a 5:30 a.m. bus to Portland. They took their previously scheduled flight but this time got off in Sacramento and bussed to San Francisco... all but John Clemmons, who was escorted on to Fullerton for a doctor's examination. They practiced **Thursday** night at 7 at USF. After beating the Dons on **Friday**, they had a 7:45 a.m. bus on **Saturday** to San Francisco Airport for a flight to Orange County Airport, arriving on campus at noon. They faced the prospect of a 3:30 a.m. departure on **Sunday** and a 6-hour layover in Oakland, but an industrious travel agent found enough tickets on two America West flights on **Monday** morning out of LAX -- party of 8 at 7 a.m. and party of 15 at noon -- to Baltimore via Phoenix. They will skip practice, play **Tuesday** and then on **Wednesday** head for South Carolina, Las Vegas or home.

**DEFENSE WINS:** While the Titans continue to lead the Big West Conference in team scoring at 75.5 points per game, their improved defense has been the glaring strength in the late-season success. For the first 14 games of the season opponents were shooting .491. Over the last 17 games, they have shot only .435. Three times in that span the Titans held an opponent to 55 points -- Feb. 3 at UC Riverside, Feb. 7 at UC Davis and Mar. 10 vs. UC Santa Barbara. USF's .351 effort on Friday was the second lowest this season by a CSF foe.

**SO DOES REBOUNDING:** Despite a diminutive roster and perimeter oriented attack, the Titans have found rebounding a strength in this memorable season. Fullerton is plus 4.1 in rebounding margin and has 119 more offensive rebounds than its opponents.

**RALPHY HOLMES:** Will be examined Monday for an apparent torn medial collateral ligament and / or torn miniscus in his left knee. At this writing, he is leading the Big West Conference in scoring at 16.920 points per game, just ahead of teammate Bobby Brown (16.839 ppg) and Idaho's Dandrick Jones (16.833 ppg), whose season is completed. Holmes also leads in rebounding at 8.8 rpg ahead of Utah State's Spencer Nelson (7.9 rpg), yet he only made the All-Big West Conference second team. Holmes was one basket shy of leading the BWC in scoring two years ago at 17.44 ppg to 17.46 by Varnie Dennis of Cal Poly. He finished this season spectacularly with 6 double-doubles in the last 8 games topped by the school's first Div. I triple-double with 14 points, 13 rebounds and a career-high 10 assists vs. Cal State Northridge on March 5. He had 11 double-doubles in all and was one rebound away from four others. He was named Big West Player of the Week (thru Feb. 27) for two double-doubles in 79 minutes of play in wins at UCSB and Cal Poly. At USF, he injured his knee midway through the first half but kept playing and finished with 16 of the team's 28 points and 9 rebounds before intermission.

**YAPHETT ADDS TO SCORING 'POWER':** The loss of Hardy Asprilla turned Yaphett King into the power forward and he became a second-team All-Big West Conference selection -- no doubt taking away votes from Holmes. King has averaged 16.0 points over the final 16 games to end up No. 7 in the BWC in scoring at 14.0 ppg. He made the BWC All-Tournament team with 37 points & 14 rebounds in 2 games. He has been explosive -- a 19-point first half vs. Cal Poly, a 17-point first half vs. UC Riverside, a 17-point first half vs. Pacific, a 15-point first half vs. Cal State Northridge, a 15-point second half vs. UC Davis and a 16-point second half vs. Long Beach. Three times he has been the "go-to" guy down the stretch. Vs. Colgate on Nov. 20, he scored 9 of his 11 points and 9 of the team's final 13 to hold off a Colgate rally. At Northridge, he scored 8 of the team's final 12 points in regulation and added 4 more points in overtime including the game-winning bucket. At Cal Poly on Feb. 26 he personally erased a 3-point SLO lead in the final minute with a bucket and then a 3-point play with 9.1 seconds to play. And against Utah State on Feb. 19, his 3-pointer with 39 seconds to play was the back-breaker for the Aggies, turning a 1-point lead into a 4-point cushion with 39 seconds left.

**JERMAINE HARPER:** The University of Virginia transfer is a textbook example of a "streak" shooter. For example, in three games vs. Utah State this year he was 2-for-9 in Logan, 0-for-7 in Fullerton and 7-for-11 in Anaheim from 3-point range. His scoring has been all over the board -- he has scored 4 points or less nine times (going scoreless 4 times) this season yet he has had four games of 20 or more points. In the other 18 games he has had between 7 and 16 points. He has taken 183 3-point field goal attempts and only 78 2-pointers this season. In conference play the breakdown was 94 treys and 36 deuces. He failed to score for three consecutive halves on Feb. 19 & 24 (2 vs. Utah State and the first half at UCSB), but had 8 second-half points (3-of-4 shooting) to help the Titans pull away from the Gauchos. His defense on opponents' top perimeter shooter has been solid. His 68 3-pointers made rank No. 7 on the Cal State Fullerton single-season list.

**BOBBY BROWN:** Last year's freshman of the year in the Big West Conference made the honorable mention list this season but has played at a first-team level since the end of the regular season. He has played all but 22 seconds of the last four games with 86 points, 13 rebounds, 10 assists and 12 turnovers. He garnered Big West Conference Player of the Week (thru Feb. 20) honors for his role in the home wins over Idaho and Utah State. He had 37 points (14-for-28 shooting) and 10 assists. Despite a late-season shooting slump, he still is the conference's No. 2 scorer (16.8 ppg), No. 2 assists man (4.77 apg) and runnerup in 3-pointers made per game (2.68). With 83 3-point field goals, he has the No. 2 Titan single-season total (No. 1 is Don Leary with 89 in 1992-93), surpassing his 70 of last season, which rank No. 5. He ranks No. 3 career with 153 treys and trails only five-year players Chris Dade (191) and Chris St. Clair (185).

**JAMAAL BROWN ON A ROLL:** Jamaal Brown's play the past 16 games is probably the biggest reason for the Titans' 13-3 record and earned him honorable mention all-conference honors. After averaging 8 points (8-for-23 FGs) in the 3-game losing streak, he's had 198 points (85-of-158 FGs, .538) in the last 16 games with 117 rebounds (7.3 rpg). Vs. USF he scored all 18 of his points and had 7 rebounds in the second half. He made 10-of-11 shots at UC Irvine on Feb. 10 including the game-turning field goal with 25 seconds left and two clinching free throws with 6 seconds left. His defense on Spencer Nelson vs. Utah State in the second half on Feb. 19 was critical in the Titans' rally from an 8-point deficit at the intermission. And he won the home finale vs. Cal State Northridge with a buzzer-beating tip-in for a game-high 19 points. His absence due to foul trouble (played only 21 minutes) was significant in the March 11 Big West Tournament loss to the Aggies.

**HOME MAGIC BACK?:** Titan Gym used to be a "pit" to opponents. Between the 1981-82 and 1992-93 seasons, Fullerton had a winning home record every year with a total of 118 wins vs. 43 losses (.733). Under Bob Hawking (39-37) and Donny Daniels (13-26), the record fell to 52-63 (.452) for the 1994-95 thru 2002-03 seasons. But Fullerton was 10-2 (.833) this season, its best home mark since the 1982-83 team was 13-0. The Titans have won 15 of the last 18 at home. Last year's team was 8-6 at home after a 3-5 start.

**ROAD MILESTONES:** Fullerton finished Big West Conference play with a 5-4 road record, its first winning conference season away from home at the Div. I level (dates to 1974-75). At 9-6 (11-8 including neutral court games), the Titans have a winning overall away record for the first time since the 1988-89 team went 8-6.

**DOUBLE FIGURES:** With five players averaging 9.7 ppg or more, it's not surprising to see the Titans spreading the scoring load around. All five of the "current" starters have led the team in a game -- B.Brown 13 times, Holmes (9), King (5), Harper (2), J. Brown (4) -- and five times at least five players have been in double figures. Six Titans (B. Brown 21, Asprilla 16, Harper 16, King 15, Burns 14 and Quinet 10) did it vs. Hope International.

**NOT MUCH SCORING FROM BENCH:** Conversely, the Titans' bench is not much of an offensive threat -- it hasn't scored in the last three games. In the last 14 games, the bench has produced only 60 TOTAL points -- in reverse chronological order: 0, 0, 0, 5, 3, 4, 5, 7, 6, 4, 3, 7, 9, 7. Of course, the starters don't leave the floor much. In the last 17 games the starters are averaging 33.4 minutes per man (Holmes = 36.6; B. Brown = 35.8; J. Brown = 31.7; Harper = 31.5; & King = 32.1).

**STUDENTS GET FIRST LOOK:** Remarkably, Cal State Fullerton did not play its first home game of the season with students in session until Feb. 17. The Nov. 27 Hope game came during Thanksgiving Holiday and the Dec. 23 game vs. Denver came during the Christmas recess. The balance came during intersession in January. A crowd of 2,076 showed up Feb. 17 for the Idaho game, making it the largest home gathering since 4,128 saw a win over UNLV on March 6, 1993. The Idaho total was later topped by the UoP game of March 3 when 3,576 showed up and the north balcony bleachers had to be utilized for the first time in years.

**3-BOMBS AWAY:** Fullerton is averaging 7.97 makes (to lead the Big West) and 22.3 attempts per game. The current totals of 247 made and 690 attempted have obliterated school single-season records (old marks: 196 makes last season and 551 attempts in 1996-97). As goes perimeter shooting, the results have seldom been "average." They shot a season's worst 3-for-18 vs. UC Riverside on Jan. 6 and two nights later a season's best 10-for-18 vs. UC Davis. The 14 3-pointers vs. UC Irvine on Jan. 15 tied the school single-game record originally set on Dec. 9, 2003, vs. USC. The Titans made 10 in the second half of the UCI game and 9 in the first half at UCR on Feb. 3. They were 8-for-17 in the first half at Oregon State and 1-for-10 in the second half and overtime. At USF they were 10-for-20 overall.

**FLYING HIGH:** The Titans have flown out of town after a win five times this season -- vs. Colgate at Central Connecticut, at Eastern Washington, at UC Davis, out of Portland on the way to Sacramento/San Francisco and then out of San Francisco. Those five "air" wins surpass the PAST SEVEN SEASONS COMBINED, to wit: 1-6 in 1997-98; 0-8 in 1998-99; 0-7 in 1999-2000; 1-6 in 2000-01; 0-6 in 2001-02; 1-6 in 2002-03 and 0-5 in 2003-04 for a total of 3-44. Compare that to this year's 5-4 mark (also lost to Samford in Connecticut, at Denver, at Utah State and at Idaho).

**NUMBER SWITCH:** Jamaal Brown was going to wear No. 4 this season for the Titans in honor of his former Western Kentucky teammate Nathan Eisert, who committed suicide. Jamaal gave up that jersey at the TV taping and opted for No. 32, a number his dad wore.

**NETWORK EXPOSURE:** ABC's highly rated *Extreme Makeover: Home Edition* came to Titan Gym on Dec. 8 to tape a tribute to Rodney Anderson, the former Titan player whose family received the full treatment from the show between Dec. 4 and 14, getting TWO new homes to replace their 1911-built residence in South Central L.A. The taping featured the retirement of his jersey (No. 4) and was included in a special two-hour episode that aired on Jan. 16 and a one-hour segment on Jan. 17. Rodney was shot in a mistaken-identity gang shooting near his home on Mar. 2, 2000, and is paralyzed and in a wheelchair. He is scheduled to graduate in June with a degree in human services. He and his girlfriend, Monique, were married on Dec. 13 in their new yard as part of the show.

**CAL STATE FULLERTON IN A NUTSHELL:** Suburban/urban commuter campus with more than 32,000 students, almost one third of them adult night students. Student body is 61 percent female. School is best known for its education department (one third of the teachers in Orange County), business school and athletic training program. Athletics program has won 12 national championships in 7 different sports, most notably four Div. I baseball titles including 2004. School played football from 1970 to 1992. Current NBA players Bruce Bowen (San Antonio) and Pape Sow (Toronto) are former Titans as are about a dozen major league baseball players including Phil Nevin, Mark Kotsay, Aaron Rowand and Chad Cordero. There is virtually no television or radio coverage of the Titans until post-season play. Both the *Los Angeles Times* and *Orange County Register* have ceased traveling beat writers in the past few years. The most famous of almost 150,000 alumni is actor/producer Kevin Costner. And, in Washington, D.C., Congressman Ed Royce.
